None of us was concerned with winning; we just wanted to enjoy the experience. And we sure did!



We each took our detailed route instructions and began our adventure for the day. Audra & Wendy were in car #8, which meant they were the 8th car out of the starting gate (*cars leave in 1-minute intervals*).
